



## Freie Universitaet Berlin – School of Business & Economics Doctoral Program "Research on Organizational Paths"

The program is directed toward graduates in business studies, as well as other social sciences with an interest in organizational processes. Its goal is to educate particularly qualified and motivated graduates with either Diplom, Magister, or Master's degrees, or a comparable degree from a foreign university, in a theory- and method-oriented doctoral study program. The program, sponsored by the German Research Foundation (DFG), began on April 1, 2005. For a second cohort, that will start on **April 1, 2008**, the DFG will grant for a maximum length of three years

## 15 Doctoral scholarships.

The subject matter of the program is research on the processes of path dependence, path breaking and path creation in and between organizations, based on the **Theory of Path Dependency**. "Reform gridlock" and inertia, but also the implementation of innovations under the use of technical standards will be examined as the results of path dependencies and the emerging lock-ins. The aim, however, should not be limited to the discovery and explanation of organizational path dependencies, but the possibilities of a breaking or intentionally creating paths will also be investigated.

- Detailed statement of interest in the doctoral program
