At the 28th EGOS Colloquium Amalya L. Oliver of Hebrew University, Jerusalem, and Georg Schreyögg and Jörg Sydow of Freie Universität Berlin will convene the sub-theme *Self-reinforcing Processes in Organizations, Networks and Professions*. The Colloquium will be held in Helsinki, Finland from 2th to 7th July 2012. This sub-theme will foster exchange of theoretical ideas and empirical insights that might be conducive to further understanding of self-reinforcing mechanisms that feature prominently in and beyond organizations (www.egos2012.net). By the way, the 29th EGOS Colloquium will be held in Montréal Canada with the theme *Bridging Continents, Cultures and Worldviews* from July 4th to 6th [2013](#). The colloquium for the European Group for Organizational Studies (EGOS) will be taking place outside of Europe for the first time.
