Visa Requirements	
EU/EFTA nationals (except Croatia)	EU/EFTA nationals have to apply for a residence permit in their place of residence after arrival in Switzerland. A relevant form will be provided by the International Office. No visa is required.
Non-EU/EFTA nationals and nationals from Croatia	For most Non-EU/EFTA nationals a student visa is required. Information on visa requirements is available at <a href="https://www.eda.admin.ch/eda/en/fdfa/entry-switzerland-residence.html">https://www.eda.admin.ch/eda/en/fdfa/entry-switzerland-residence.html</a> . The visa process takes at least 8 weeks. A tourist visa does not authorize studying in Switzerland.  After arriving in Switzerland students have to apply for a residence permit in their place of residence. A relevant form will be provided by the International Office.
Finances	
Cost of Living	Students must allow for a minimum of CHF 1,500 per month to cover living expenses in Switzerland.
Work	Exchange students are allowed a maximum of 15 hours work per week. Non-EU students are not allowed to work during the first 6 months of residence in Switzerland.

Students from Non-EU/EFTA countries who have health insurance in their home country have to apply for exemption from mandatory health insurance in Switzerland. The relevant form will be provided by the International Office. If health insurance in the home country is not sufficient according to Swiss law, the International Office will take out insurance for the students (free of charge for students).
