## Upcoming Events

From 4th to 6th July 2013, the 29th EGOS Colloquium will be held in Montréal, Canada with the general theme *Bridging Continents, Cultures and Worldviews*. The colloquium for the European Group for Organizational Studies (EGOS) will be taking place outside of Europe for the first time ([www.egos2013.net](http://www.egos2013.net)). Georg Schreyögg, Freie Universität Berlin, Martha S. Feldman, University of California, and Jörg Sydow, Freie Universität Berlin, will present the sub-theme [Bridging Time: Exploring the Dynamics of Routines and Path Dependence](#), which covers the temporalization of routines and the relations between patterns of persistence and patterns of change. A special focus will be on exploring the temporal patterning of and tensions between the logic of change in and through routines and the self-reinforcing dynamics of stabilization in and between organizations. 60 short papers have been submitted and are currently being examined. The sub-theme's chairs will arrange for some parallel sessions so that they can accept more than the usual 21 papers. The three convenors look forward to interesting discussions in Montreal.

Please also note, that from 17th to 19th February 2014, the 3rd International Conference On Path Dependence will be held in Berlin with the Call for Papers soon to follow.
